

## 6th Annual Lieutenant Governor's AWARDS for PUBLIC SAFETY

### HELP SALUTE OUR SAFETY CHAMPIONS

Do you know a safety superhero? A person, an organization or a group of people in your community or workplace that should be recognized for making British Columbia safer? We want to know who they are, recognize their work and honour their contribution to safety.

### PROMOTING A SAFER BRITISH COLUMBIA

For the past six years, the Lieutenant Governor's Awards for Public Safety have honoured individuals and organizations that make our communities and workplaces safer.

The awards are presented by the BC Safety Authority under the auspices of the Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia. Together, we salute outstanding contributions to safety throughout the province and various industries with the purpose of encouraging and acknowledging all those who are dedicated to making our province a safer place to work, live and play.

There are three awards:

- Lifetime Achievement
- Exceptional Contribution to Public Safety: Individual
- Exceptional Contribution to Public Safety: Organization

### BRITISH COLUMBIA SAFETY AUTHORITY

At the British Columbia Safety Authority, we keep people safe by mandating the safe installation and use of technical equipment. As one of the Province's delegated authorities, we administer safety standards and enforce compliance. We also issue permits and licences, educate, and conduct onsite inspections in high-risk situations. We continuously advance the standards of safe practices in BC.

The BC Safety Authority oversees the following industry sectors in the province:

- amusement rides
- boilers, pressure vessels and refrigeration systems
- electrical equipment and systems
- elevating devices, such as elevators and escalators
- gas appliances and systems, including hydrogen
- passenger ropeways, such as aerial trams and ski lifts, and
- railways, including commuter rail

### AWARD CRITERIA

The goal of the Lieutenant Governor's Awards for Public Safety is to promote safe practices, procedures, behaviours and attitudes. The awards recognize those who demonstrate exceptional leadership, achievement and innovation in the promotion of safety in British Columbia.

Award recipients demonstrate one or more of the following:

- Lifetime achievement: An individual's significant and sustained contribution to safety over a number of years.
- Exceptional leadership: An individual or organization that has demonstrated insight, judgement, and the ability to lead and inspire, resulting in a significant improvement in safety standards, behaviours or procedures.
- Significant achievements: Development of a program or procedure that has significantly improved the safety of a community, workplace or recreational setting.
- Groundbreaking innovation: Development of a new technology, service or program that has led to improved safety standards, procedures or practices.

### AWARD ELIGIBILITY

- A nominated organization must be registered or operating as a BC business or society or as a division or department of a municipal or regional government.
- A sponsor organization that has partnered with another organization in safety initiatives may be nominated.
- A nominated individual must be a resident of British Columbia.
- Joint nominations for two or more individuals or organizations working in partnership on a common initiative are eligible.
- Directors and staff of the BC Safety Authority, and staff of Government House, are ineligible for nomination.
- Award recipient(s) or a representative should be available to attend the awards luncheon on November 23, 2010, at the Vancouver Convention Centre.

### AWARD SELECTION

Award recipients are selected by the Lieutenant Governor's Public Safety Selection Committee, which includes a senior staff member of the BC Safety Authority, representatives of partnering safety organizations, and other respected individuals in the safety field.

Award recipients will be recognized for their contributions to safety at the annual Lieutenant Governor's Awards for Public Safety luncheon to be held on Tuesday, November 23, 2010, at the Vancouver Convention Centre.

### NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS

**Nominations Deadline: Friday, September 17, 2010**

#### A complete nomination package must include:

- **Nomination Form:** Please complete a Public Safety Awards nomination form in detail, and submit it with all documentation.
- **Nomination Description:** Provide up to a one-page description of the reasons the individual or organization should be considered for an award.
- **Nominee Profile:** Provide a one-page personal biography or corporate profile.
- **Supporting Reference Letters:** Provide two letters supporting the nomination. Letters must be signed and include contact information.
- **Optional:** Provide up to three pages of additional information or supporting documentation about your nominee.

Please note, it is the responsibility of the nominator to ensure that the nomination package is complete and includes the supporting reference letters at the time it is submitted to the BC Safety Authority. Nomination packages will not be returned and will be kept confidential.

All documentation must be received by the nomination deadline. We regret that late or incomplete submissions will not be considered by the Lieutenant Governor's Public Safety Selection Committee.
